

Latin America: Steel imports from China reached 412 thousands tons during January 2018

- In the first month of the year, China exported to the world 4.4 million tons (Mt) of steel. Of that amount, 412 thousands tons were shipped to Latin America.
- Chinese steel received by Latin America contracted 50% compared with January 2017.
- The region's share of Chinese steel exports reached 9.0% (vs. 11% in Jan 2017).

Alacero - Santiago, Chile, March 13th, 2017. In January 2018, Chinese steel exports sent to the world, -which includes finished steel (long steel, flat steel and seamless pipes) and steel-derivatives products (wire and welded pipes)-, decreased 39% versus January 2017, reached 4.4 million tons (Mt) of steel. Of this total, 3.9 Mt were finished steel and 502 thousands tons.


Latin America accounted for 9.0% of total global exports, reducing its participation in two percentage points versus Jan 2017 (11%) and standing at second place as China's preferred destination. The region is preceded by South Korea with 563 thousands tons (13% of the global total).

In January 2018, Chinese steel exports to the region contracted 50% compared to January 2017 (822 thousand tons), reaching 412 thousand tons of steel (362 thousand tons were finished steel and 50 thousand tons were steel-derivatives products).

Although the Asian giant announced that will cut their steel production by 30 Mt in 2018, there is a possibility that China will starts exporting more to Latin America following the announcement of last Thursday by the United States President Donald Trump regarding the imposition of 25% of tariffs on steel imports. It's estimated that this decision may cause a diversion of trade to the region. For this reason the governments and industries of each country should be alert to a sudden and unexpected growth of imports.

In the case of steel-derivatives products during January 2018, Latin America received 50 thousand tons from China, representing at the first place of the global destination (10% of the total). The region is followed by the Philippines (41 thousand tons, 8% of the total) and South Korea (31 thousand tons, 6% of the total).

Finished steel imports from China by destination


The main destinations for Chinese steel (finished + steel-derivatives) in Latin American during January 2018 were: Brazil which received 111 thousand tons (27 % of the region); Peru with 68 thousand tons (17%); and Chile, 59 thousand tons (14%).

During the first month of the year, Brazil was the only country that increased its import of Chinese steel versus January 2017 (43% more).

On the other hand, the countries that have reduce their imports of Chinese steel products versus January 2017 were: Venezuela (-98%), Cuba (-96%), Argentina (-80%) and Central America (-73%).

Imports from China by products

Flat steel were the main products imported by Latin America from China during January 2018, reaching 302 thousand tons (63% of total). The most relevant products in terms of volume were:

- Hot dip galvanized sheet (79 thousand tons, 26% share of flat steel imported from China)
- Other alloyed steel sheets and coils (70 thousand tons, 23%)
- Cold rolled coil (61 thousand tons, 20%)



Long steel: China exported to Latin America 47 thousand tons (26% of the total), mainly concentrated in:

- Wire rod (23 thousand tons, 48% share of long steels)
- Bars (19 thousands tons, 40%)


The region received 13 thousand tons of seamless pipes (2% of the total).

Meanwhile, steel-derivate products represent 9% of total imports of Chinese steel in the region, with a volume of 50 thousand tons, where:

- Welded tubes (39 thousands tons)
- Wire (11 thousands tons)

Glossary

Finished steel: Refers to steel included in one of these 3 groups: Long products (e.g.: reinforcing bars, bars, wire rod, light sections, heavy sections, rails), flat steel (e.g.: sheets and coils, coated sheets, pre-painted, stainless steel, chrome-plate sheets, hot dip galvanized sheet etc.) and seamless tubes.

Steel- derivatives products: Refers to the products that come from finished steel (welded tubes being the most significant item).

Central America: Considers Guatemala, Belize, Honduras, El Salvador, Nicaragua, Costa Rica and Panama.

Ton: A unit of weight or volume of sea cargo, equal to a metric ton (1,000 kg).
